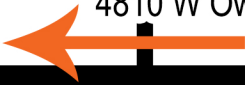

Dragonfly in Paradise

Edward Jones, Jenna Rosine - 225 W Maple Ave

This mural is a reminder to live life to the fullest and travel the world with family and friends. The Dragonfly symbolizes transformation and the understanding of the deeper meaning of life, often thought to be a visitor from heaven. It has 22 in its eyes, as a nod to the late SPC Kaleb George. At age 22 he was one of the 22 veterans we lose each day to suicide. Like a dragonfly, he lived a short but full and meaningful life.

Love for All Seasons

Enid Floral & Gifts - 1123 S Van Buren

With this four-part mural we wanted to show the beauty of the four seasons, while creating one cohesive look. Spring features purple Crocus, pink Ranunculus, and a ladybug. Summer includes a red Gerbera Daisy and a bee, because bees are important pollinators that allow us to have beautiful flowers and delicious fruits and vegetables. Fall features a Dahlia and a Tiger Swallowtail butterfly. Winter includes a Helleborus (also known as a Christmas Rose), some evergreen and Holly.

Feeding Our Neighbors

Loaves & Fishes NW OK - 701 E Maine Ave

This mural at our local food pantry is a welcoming reminder of the fresh produce they provide to hungry families. It was also a surprise tribute to Gail Wynne, tireless volunteer and Founding Mother of Loaves & Fishes. It features produce, her favorite flower (hydrangea), her hand holding radishes, and her family's brand in the center of the watermelon swirls. Since a generous funder paid for the mural, we turned the 33 colors into a \$3,300 fundraiser to help them feed more people.

New Day on the Old Trail

Big Country Meat Market - 606 W Willow Rd

This mural had a deeper meaning than we expected. Philip and Hollee Terry asked for a mural to commemorate the Chisholm Trail. To create drama, I chose the longhorn, with his horn extending above the concrete block wall, onto the wooden area above. The scissor-tailed flycatchers eat ticks and flies off of their longhorn friends. They are part of each morning's sunrise in the East and they watch each evening's sunset together toward the West.

Flanders Flowers

Unique Designs T-Shirts & More - 1814 N Grand

This mural was inspired by the 1915 "In Flanders Fields" poem by John McCrae. He wrote it as a memorial to soldiers who died in a battle fought in WWI in a region of Belgium called Flanders. The poem describes the poppies growing over their graves. Poppies are symbols of Remembrance Day, now Veterans Day in the US. The yellow ribbon is for those deployed, Prisoners of War, and Missing in Action.

Oklahoma Phoenix

Atelier - 339 E Maple

This was our second mural to paint for Cheri and Ben Ezzell, a mother and son, who purchased half a city block to create studio spaces for artists, called Atelier. The mural includes a graphic representation of a stormy Oklahoma sky and a scissor-tailed flycatcher. We often get caught up in the swirl of the storm, whether that is grief, anxiety, or other things we go through, and sometimes we can break free into happiness, like the bird rising into the bright sky.

Grillin' Together

Big Country Meat Market - 606 W Willow Rd

This mural (name inspired by Smokey Robinson's Cruisin' song) celebrates gathering and grilling together again with family and friends as we hope to come out of this pandemic.

Play Takes Flight

Universal Management - 201 N Van Buren St

This mural is about play leading to discovery, innovation, and breakthroughs. The Covid-19 pandemic became a local reality while painting this mural. With so many parents taking the role of teacher during that confusing time, this was a reminder of how much can be learned from a simple piece of paper, such as lift and aerodynamics. The paper airplane symbolically transforms into a T-38, as a nod to Vance Air Force Base.

Jeans N' Roses

In the 20th century, the romantic love of red roses was combined with the friendship and caring of yellow roses, resulting in orange roses, symbolizing energy and excitement. With a little patience, all three were lovingly embroidered onto the denim-colored wall at Kustom Kreations, resulting in Jeans N' Roses. Adding color to our own paradise city, these roses will be in bloom, even through a cold November rain.
